XYZ AmeriCorps Performance Measures and Student Criteria

A. Performance Measures

1. 96 AmeriCorps members will provide mentoring/supportive guidance/coaching to a total of 1,000 K-12 students.
2. 96 AmeriCorps members will sustain supportive mentoring and/or academic coaching to a total of 750 K-12 students one-to-one or in small groups at least one hour each week for a minimum of 6 months.
3. 70% (525 students) of the 750 students who sustain their supportive mentoring and/or academic support relationship for a minimum of six months will have demonstrated improved academic engagement as measured by pre and post student surveys.

B. What are the criteria for students to be served by XYZ AmeriCorps members?

1. Full-time and half-time members may only serve students in 3rd – 8th grade.
2. Education award only members may serve students in K – 12th grade.
3. We **MUST** have the pre-student survey for all students once they join a member's caseload. Post student surveys are due at the end of the school year or when a student terminates from a member's caseload.
4. **Member caseloads should be filled by November 4, 2015.**
5. The student must be matched up with only one AmeriCorps member.
6. The student and the AmeriCorps member should stay together for the duration of the school year if possible. We understand that students may leave the school or members may end their service early, but the goal is to keep the match together for as long as possible.
7. The students and the AmeriCorps member should meet for a minimum of one hour a week.
8. The AmeriCorps member must do service logs for each student on their caseload.

C. How many students much each AmeriCorps member serve?

1. Full-time members must serve no more than 20 students during the year.
2. Part-time members must serve no more than 12 students during the year.
3. Education award only members must serve at least 6 students during the year.
4. Members should not drop students to add more. We want to serve the students for the duration of the school year if at all possible.

D. What is the Site Supervisor's role?

1. Match the student with the member to ensure the student meets the criteria above and is an appropriate student for member's to serve (i.e. students who do not have special needs and students without mental health issues).
2. Create a plan with the members on your campus to obtain pre and student surveys.
3. Assist the member in devising a schedule to ensure the minimum student time of one hour per week.
4. Assist the member to ensure that data logs are entered and up-to-date.
